"I remember having to make a decision," she says. "Whether to provide Christmas gifts for the children or pay the electric bill. I ended up paying my electric bill. We didn't have money for gifts. We barely had money for food."

Most of us probably can't imagine that kind of need. But here at the Mission, we see it every day. And it's heartbreaking, especially at Christmas.


