Jonathan was homeless, hungry and didn't have a penny to his name.


So it was ironic that while panhandling on the streets of Washington, D.C., a stranger approached him and asked if Jonathan had any spare change. The man wanted to get something to eat.

"Listen, man, I don't have any money," Jonathan replied. "I need something to eat myself." That's when the stranger suddenly remembered, "I know where we can get something to eat." He brought Jonathan to Central Union Mission. But he didn't stay long.

Jonathan grabbed a sandwich and left without saying goodbye. That night, he found himself in the same sad situation — drunk, homeless and alone.

Jonathan remembered how hopeless his life had seemed the last time he was living on the streets. That's when Jonathan says he sensed God telling him to go back to where he got the sandwich.

He returned to the Mission the next day, desperate to find the hope that seemed so elusive.

This time, Jonathan began to take small steps toward turning his life around. He went through detox and started attending church. But our staff challenged him to go deeper, asking him, “What do you really need?”

“I knew I had to be vulnerable and I had to be honest about what I was in need of, so I told them everything,” Jonathan admits. “I told them I was struggling with alcohol and drug addiction. I told them I needed counseling. And I admitted that I needed all the help I could get.”

Knowing he couldn’t keep panhandling with another bitterly cold winter about to bear down on Washington, D.C., Jonathan joined our Restoration and Transformation Program, which is designed to free men from drugs, alcohol and other destructive behavior.

Although Jonathan admits the first six months were hard, he finally surrendered to God’s redemptive love — and saw his life do a dramatic 180-degree turnaround!

“This program does exactly what the title says,” Jonathan explains. “It restored my whole life and helped me reconcile my relationships with my family,” including reconnecting with his ex-wife and their four daughters. “It transformed me.”

Thanks to God’s grace and your support, Jonathan is rejoicing this Easter because you helped restore him to wholeness. Now he’s working on his bachelor’s degree in biblical studies and will soon be joining D.C. Central Kitchen’s culinary arts program, which he hopes will lead to full-time employment.

“Once I’m fully independent,” he adds, “I look forward to pouring back into Central Union Mission the way they poured into me.”

The Mission announces a critical expansion of our Family Resource Center

Together, let’s flood the Washington, D.C., area with hope

Over the last two years, the COVID-19 pandemic has had a devastating effect on thousands of poor people in the Washington D.C., area.

As much as we’ve tried to keep up — providing food, overnight shelter and other assistance such as healthcare, legal aid, counseling, addiction support and housing assistance — we haven’t been able to keep pace with the need.

But that’s about to change in a dramatic way. Thanks to you and other generous and faithful supporters, we can announce that we’ll soon be expanding our Family Resource Center.

This expansion will deepen support programs, add services and increase the number of people being served — now as many as 5,750 each month. Changes will include:



A wider variety of educational opportunities (especially computer literacy) and retraining for jobs in the new economy

Increased health care assistance



Greater access to help with addiction recovery



Transportation access
