In response to COVID-19, the museums closed their doors to the public and stayed closed for almost two years. When they did re-open, not all employees were called back. Others were offered only part-time work.

Everything changed

Jeremy and Jennifer had always managed to make ends meet. They were proud that they lived within their means and did not rely on public or private assistance to provide for their family. But the pandemic turned their world upside down.

Suddenly, their meager savings ran out, and they didn't have enough food. Even COVID masks and hard-to-get sanitation products were beyond their budget. Eventually, their church referred them to Central Union Mission for help.

Blindsided

Twice a month, for almost two years, Jeremy and Jennifer came to the Mission, where they were greeted with understanding, care and the love of Jesus.

Like thousands of others blindsided by the pandemic, they received bags of groceries, household supplies and other help, such as school supplies for their children. They even received a turkey and fixings at Thanksgiving and gifts for their children at Christmas.

Eventually, when restrictions began to lift, they both returned to work part time. With the continued support of the Mission, their family is stable, grateful and hopeful for better days to come.

Jeremy and Jennifer's story is not unique among the working poor who came to our Family Ministry Center for help during those bad days. Like so many others, they were at the lower end of the pay scale — the first to be laid off and the last to see recovery.

But over the last two years, the Mission has been a lifesaver, serving an average of 4,000 people every month when they were at their lowest. We also provided COVID testing, medical services, Bibles, prayer and more. We even delivered groceries to those who were unable to make it to our doors.




